

FACTSHEET: All Things ADEL

What is ADEL?

- ADEL is WADA's Anti-Doping Education and Learning Platform.
- ADEL, originally launched in 2018, was significantly redeveloped and relaunched in January 2021.
- ADEL hosts education programs and other resources that can be used as part of an anti-doping education program.
- It also hosts resources for anti-doping practitioners to help them in the development and implementation of their anti-doping programs.



Where can I access ADEL?

- ADEL can be accessed [here](#).
- ADEL is also available as a mobile App 'ADEL by WADA' that can be downloaded from the Google Play or Apple stores.
- Anyone can view information available on ADEL's public pages, but will need to register and/or log in to access the educational resources.

Who is ADEL for?

- ADEL is for anyone involved in or interested in clean sport who wants to learn more! Anyone can register for ADEL.
- This includes, but not limited to:
 - Athletes;
 - Coaches;
 - Parents;
 - Medical professionals; and
 - Other athlete support personnel.



- It is also for anti-doping practitioners so they can access resources related to the World Anti-Doping Code and International Standards helping them to develop and implement their anti-doping programs and, in the future, access training programs relevant to their role. This is our Code Implementation Support Program (CISP) and can be accessed via the ADO zone.

Is ADEL free?

- Yes! ADEL is offered at no cost.

What is on ADEL?

- Education programs – these eLearning programs are available for athletes, coaches, parents and medical professionals. Some examples include:
 - Education programs for athletes that are tailored to their level of development as set out in the athlete pathway which you can find in the International Standard for Education (ISE) Guidelines:
 - International-level athlete
 - National-level athlete
 - Talented-level athlete
 - Youth athlete
 - Children and school sport
 - Guides for athletes and athlete support personnel
 - The Guides and information booklets that can be viewed digitally or downloaded.
 - Examples include:
 - Guide to the 2021 Code
 - Guide to the 2021 Prohibited List
 - At-a-Glance series
- Digital hub of resources for anti-doping practitioners (factsheets, templates, checklists, webinars etc.) relating to the Code and the International Standards as part of CISP.

If I am an Anti-Doping Organization (ADO) can I see who is being educated on ADEL?

- Yes, as an ADO (International Federation, National Anti-doping Organization, Major Event Organization), or even as a delegated third party, you can request access to view, track, assign and monitor who under your jurisdiction is completing education on ADEL. Those with this special permission are called Power Users.
- To become a Power User, you need to make a via the ADEL Helpdesk which can be found [here](#).
- Once approved, you will need to sign a Power User Agreement and then you will have access to groups of users who are most likely to fall under your jurisdiction.

What languages is ADEL available in?

- Currently the ADEL platform is available in English, French and Spanish.
- WADA aims to publish all of its education programs and resources in these three languages.
- ADOs can work with WADA to translate education programs and Guides into other languages.
 - A machine translation tool, Smartling, is used to help us get started, which is then reviewed by the ADO to finalize.
 - WADA then publishes the translated version on ADEL so it is available as an option for ADEL users to be educated in their language.
 - Many ADOs have requested to translate courses on ADEL and are in different stages of translation.
